MINOR REQUIREMENTS

3 credit hours of LAS4935

undergraduate seminar

Students may repeat LAS4935 for an additional **6** credits if the topics vary.

9 credit hours of courses with

100% LAS content **3** credit hours of courses with

25% LAS content

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

in Spanish, Portuguese, or Haitian Creole

This requirement may be fulfilled by proficiency exam, coursework, or transfer credit

= 15 CREDIT HOURS TOTAL

Only courses 2000 level or higher count toward the minor. Students must earn **9** credits at the 3000 level or higher. Overseas study credit can count as a core or elective course if approved by the Undergraduate Coordinator in the Center for Latin American Studies.

CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

The undergraduate certificate requirements encompass all of the minor requirements plus an additional **6** credits of coursework in core or electives (**21** credits total).



STUDY ABROAD

Undergraduate students are encouraged to spend a summer, semester, or academic year studying in a Latin American country. UF sponsors study abroad programs in several countries.
