Our graduate certificate in Latin American Studies can be earned by students enrolled in a masters or doctoral program at the university, or as a standalone certificate. This option is a good fit for those who wish to focus their studies or professional pursuits on a topic related to Latin American, Caribbean, or Latino/a/x Studies, including Spanish, Portuguese, or Haitian Creole.

Students who pursue a graduate certificate in Latin American Studies join a university-wide network of Latin Americanists across a range of disciplines. They emerge from the program with deeper insight on realworld issues, new global perspectives, and language competencies that open the door to further study or professional application.

A graduate certificate in Latin American Studies can be earned by students pursuing any masters or doctoral degree at the University of Florida, or as a standalone certificate.

6 credit hours in graduate courses with LAS code (e.g. LAS 6938, LAS 6920)

- **6** credit hours in graduate courses with Latin American, Caribbean, and/or Latino/a/x content, selected from any academic programs, including LAS
- E CREDIT HOURS TOTAL
