<input type="checkbox"/>	TEACHER'S GUIDE: <i>In Binder: Pictures of Ofrendas, List of Links</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	COPA <i>Cup to set beverage offerings out on an altar. One should use the favorite beverage of the deceased, which traditionally was atole – a common Mexican beverage of masa (corn meal), water, piloncillo, cinnamon, vanilla and optional chocolate or fruit.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	7 FRUITS <i>Used as part of the ofrenda. fruit (7) – star fruit, prickly pear, cactus fruit etc.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	BREAD <i>8 pieces of plastic bread for offerings on the table</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	FOOD OFFERINGS (OFRENDAS) <i>Used as part of the ofrenda, one ear of corn, two tacos and one bowl.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	2 TORTUGAS GRANDES <i>Ceramic turtles with a hole in the shell for placing candles (in separate bags)</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	2 CRUCES DE MADERA <i>Crosses for the ofrenda.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	PAPER MACHE SKULL <i>Decorated with flowers and brightly colored paint.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	WOODEN OFFERING DISH (OFRENDAS) <i>This is used to place items such as fruit in while they are part of the ofrenda.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	2 WHITE TABLE CLOTHS (one plastic & one cloth) <i>These items are placed on the ofrenda. White is the traditional color of ofrenda table cloths.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	4 TALL CANDLES

<input type="checkbox"/>	2 CANDLES <i>(Candles are in glass jars)</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	2 GLASS VASES <i>One large and one small vase</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	1 TWINE SKELETON (calavera) <i>A common symbol of the holiday is the skull (colloquially called calavera).</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	1 SKULL STAMP <i>Stamp that can be used for crafts – image depicts the head of the skeleton from Diego Rivera's 1947 fresco "Dream of a Sunday Afternoon in the Alameda."</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	FAKE FLOWERS
<input type="checkbox"/>	6 SILBATOS (Whistles) <i>Small figurines of animals and people.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	PAPEL PICADO <i>Decorative cut tissue paper. Please handle with care and return folded nicely and in original bags if possible. While we replace this paper occasionally we appreciate being able to reuse as much as possible!</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	1 DEVIL STATUE <i>Small colorful figurine.</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	TISSUE PAPER (PAPEL PICADO) <i>For use in making original papel picado. (MAY USE IN CLASS)</i>

<input type="checkbox"/>	4 SMALL FIGURINES WITH BOUNCING HEADS
<input type="checkbox"/>	1 BOOK <i>Los Días de Los Muertos</i>
<input type="checkbox"/>	1 DAY OF THE DEAD BOX <i>Includes figurine and book. (Please package standing up in suitcase)</i>
