<input type="radio"/>	1 WOVEN WOOL RUG Virgin wool is very popular in the highlands.	Colombia
<input type="radio"/>	1 ARPILLERA Appliqued material used for many things, including making clothes. Groups of women often get together to make the arpilleras. Arpillera means "burlap".	Colombia
<input type="radio"/>	1 WOODEN CROSS A painted cross typical of the art after the 1979 Sandinista Revolution when a rebel army called the contras was trying to overthrow the Sandinista government.	Nicaragua
<input type="radio"/>	1 HAIR CLASP W/DOLLS It is decorated with tiny dolls dressed in highland clothes.	Bolivia
<input type="radio"/>	1 PONCHO A poncho woven by the Mayas from Guatemala.	Guatemala
<input type="radio"/>	1 WOVEN BRACELET	Guatemala
<input type="radio"/>	1 WOVEN BELT A brightly colored Guatemalan woven belt.	Guatemala
<input type="radio"/>	3 SAMPLES OF MAYAN EMBROIDERY Brightly colored Mayan cloth and embroidery.	Guatemala

○	1 CHUMPI A belt used for swaddling, but also for tying skirts.	Perú
○	1 PILLOW CASE	Perú
○	2 CHUSPAS Bags or purses used for carrying coca leaves or money.	Perú
○	1 CLAY FACE A clay reproduction of a Maya face	Honduras
○	2 NECKLACES Necklaces made seeds, with seedpods, and a representation of a Maya head.	Honduras
○	1 WOVEN HANDBAG A small handbag made of wool.	Honduras
○	1 WOVEN BAG A large bag used to carry goods to market or books to class.	Honduras
○	1 PAIR OF ALPARGATAS Small sandals that are form the area of Ecuador called La Esperanza.	Ecuador
○	1 HAT A traditional peasant crown-like hat	Ecuador
○	2 TAGUA FIGURINES A flyer and turtle figurine made of <i>tagua</i> , or “vegetable ivory”. The <i>tagua</i> is a nut found in the Ecuadorian rainforest.	Ecuador
○	1 DRINKING GOURD AND BEADS The drinking gourd was used during a traditional indigenous dance ceremony in which these beads were worn.	Ecuador
○	2 BOOKS ◦ <i>Kutur juyashkamanta</i> - El condor enamorado- The Condor Who Fell in Love, by Alfonso Toaquiza. A girl is taken on flying tour of Ecuador by a condor. ◦ <i>Juliupak muskuykuna</i> - Los sueños de Julio- Julio’s Dreams, by Julio Toaquiza. Children’s book in Quechua, Spanish and English about Julio’s dreams	Ecuador
